On World AIDS Day, Dec 1, 2023, the Richard M. Brodsky Foundation, a 501(c) (3) public charity will sponsor its inaugural World AIDS Marathon, half marathon, 10K & 5K on the Rockaway boardwalk in Queens, NY. Proceeds from these running events will fund the Foundation's work in Kenya & America. Our team will visit Kenya from Dec 3 - 15 to provide medical care + medicine for 800 – 1,000 orphans at 4 orphan dinner dances, two day of art, music & dancing for special needs kids + a running Event. Our mission is to improve the lives of people living w/ HIV in Kenya. Proceeds will also benefit Harmony HealthCare Long Island, St. John's Episcopal Hospital, and Northwell Health + \$750, \$500 & \$250 to non-profits for 3 teams who recruit the most registrants with respect to registration fees.

Since 2004, the Brodsky Foundation, with your help, has donated \$590,000+ in goods & services for helping people, especially children living with HIV or cancer, in Africa & America. Donations have also funded 49 festive orphan dinner dances for 12,780 Kenyan orphans, AIDS & cancer research, free concerts, 20 local 5K running events (4 were free), toys for children living with HIV and/or cancer & toiletry/gift items for people living with HIV or cancer on Long Island.

In addition, medical care and in many cases lifesaving treatment has been provided for 3,102 orphans treated at the orphan dinner dances since 2011. Placing a value on this work is not plausible. 3,500+ people were tested for the AIDS virus at the World AIDS Marathon since 2006. One of the groups testing reported HIV+ results in more than 28% of those tested, while on Long Island, the comparable rate is 1%.

Why I started the Foundation back in 2004? I was diagnosed HIV+ in 1997. In 2002, I was diagnosed with brain cancer and given 2 – 4 years to live. I promised my wife Jodi that if I survived cancer with her help, I would do everything I could to help people, especially children, living with HIV or cancer. There are still 630,000 people dying from AIDS every year. I recently turned 71 years young. 11 of my last 30 marathons have been my fastest since my cancer diagnosis. I think that people, even those living with HIV and cancer, can reverse their aging process if they lead a healthy lifestyle. On October 10, 2021, I finished the Mohawk-Hudson Marathon in 04:17:13 which qualified me, a proud grampa of 4, to run my 2nd Boston Marathon in 2023 at age 70!

For people living with HIV or cancer: exercise, eat healthy, don't smoke or drink alcohol, and never have unsafe sex if you and your partner are not committed to a monogamous relationship. To government, business and society, "people living with so-called fatal illnesses can lead healthier productive lives if we have affordable access to doctors and medicine."

Kenya has some incredibly talented runners, musicians, singers, dancers, artists and is surrounded by Lake Victoria. The Kisumu Impala Sanctuary faces Lake Victoria; a five-minute drive from Kisumu and is at the beginning of Dunga. The video showcases Dunga through music videos with slides of Kenyan artists and even animals participating in a 5K AIDS fun run + a day at JIU PACHI where orphans dine, dance and are examined by doctors. My wish is for a cultural bridge between USA and Kenya with a pavilion in the Rockaways where Kenyans could sell their paintings, jewelry, clothing, and wood carvings; Kenyan musicians could have a venue to perform; a playground & communal bar b que area; and a fish market where fresh fish could be sold & cooked from Jamaica Bay; + a small museum/theatre which could showcase videos of Dunga and the Rockaways; and residents of the Rockaways would want to travel to Dunga.



Atlantic Beach residents run for purpose

"Go Richard! Go Richard! We love you!" That's what Atlantic Beach resident Richard Brodsky heard while he was running in the Boston Marathon last month. The 70-year-old is no stranger to marathon running, but everywhere he goes, he is reminded of why he runs. "Just because you have HIV and brain cancer doesn't mean your life is over," he said.

"Two-thirds of the people that die from AIDS live in Africa, and it's because they didn't have access to the medicine," he explained. "So I wanted to raise awareness, and it was tough getting anyone to take me seriously."

He launched the <u>Richard M. Brodsky Foundation</u> in 2004. Its goal was not only to raise money for research for a cure or vaccine for AIDS, but also to provide food, medical care, shelter and shoes for orphans in Kenya.

"He is very strong about supporting what he does," Jodi said. "I am glad to go along with that."

Worlds Aids Day, marked on Dec. 1, acknowledges the 40 million people who have died of AIDS worldwide, and the Brodskys organized the World Aids Marathon in Africa for 15 years. Last December, they brought the event to Rockaway Park, in Far Rockaway, where it will be held again this year. In mid-Dec., they will make another in a series of trips to Kenya.

One doctor who takes part is Richard Sartori, whom Brodsky met in 2008. Sartori serves on the foundation's board, has joined the Brodskys in Kenya more than 10 times and has examined and treated over 1,000 orphans since 2011.

Last month, the Brodskys and Sartori were honored by President Biden with Lifetime Achievement Awards. The award recognizes people who have devoted more than 6,000 hours to volunteering.

Since its inception, the Brodsky foundation has raised about \$555,000, and Richard hopes to continue running marathons alongside his wife until he's 100 — health permitting, he said.

"The doctors didn't think I was going to survive for more than 2 – 4 years after I was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer in 2002. And 21 years later, I'm still running maramarathons." Within a span of five years, Richard Brodsky was diagnosed with two lifethreatening illnesses, which inspired him to help others. Since 2014, he has been doing that with a 5K race for a special cause in Baldwin. In 1997, Brodsky, of Atlantic Beach, was was told he had HIV, and began taking AIDS medication, which he takes to this day. Then, in 2002, he was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer, but after undergoing months of treatment, he felt well enough to run the 2003 NYC Marathon. Brodsky, a one-time architect who's now 70, realized he was extremely fortunate for the medical care he received, and wanted to give back to those in poorer countries with weaker health care systems.

In 2004, he organized the World AIDS Marathon in Mbita, Kenya. The proceeds went to an AIDS orphanage there for children who had lost one or both parents to HIV or AIDS. Brodsky said that he always wanted to host a marathon in Africa, because that's where AIDS is most common, and he wanted to raise awareness of the disease.

"The doctors didn't think I was going to survive for more than two or four years after I was diagnosed with terminal brain cancer in 2002," Brodsky said. "And 21 years later, I'm still running marathons."

He said that his drive to continue to run is fueled by the opportunity to help others. Over the years, he estimates, he has helped save the lives of 1,000+ Kenyan orphans. He doesn't just send money there, he said; he gets involved on the ground. "We go there, we get to take pictures, we dance with the orphans, and we feed them," Brodsky said. "And it's so rewarding."

NASSAU COUNTY, NY — Richard Brodsky believes he may be the only person in the world who runs marathons while being HIV positive and battling brain cancer. The 70-year-old Atlantic Beach resident and retired architect told Patch he's been searching Google, but seems to be the only person with that unique set of circumstances.

But Brodsky isn't exactly wallowing in self-pity. The avid runner will complete five marathons this year alone and qualified for the elite 2023 Boston Marathon. On Friday, he is heading to Kenya for the 16th time, accompanied by Glen Cove pediatrician Richard Sartori.

Their mission is simple: Supporting orphaned children who need medical care, and to raise awareness for AIDS. The two, with Brodsky's foundation The Richard M. Brodsky Foundation, hope to feed and provide needed care to 800 to 1,000 orphans in Kenya, Brodsky told Patch.

They ran it in Africa until this year, when they organized the <u>World Aids Marathon</u>, held Dec. 1 in Rockaway Park. The race raised money for health services in low income Nassau County and Queens areas.

The Rockaway marathon, half-marathon, 10K and 5K race was the only marathon in North America held on World Aids Day, Brodsky said. The race acknowledges the 40 million people who have died from AIDS worldwide.

"From the beginning, we really wanted to raise awareness about the effect AIDS was having on millions of people globally, especially in Third World countries," said Brodsky.

To that end, the husband and wife team set out to help the citizens of Kenya, a country then ravaged by the HIV epidemic. They hosted their first AIDS marathon there 18 years ago and have returned almost every year since.



Brodsky's humanitarian journey began in 1997 when he tested positive for HIV. Five years later, he was diagnosed with brain cancer and given two to four years to live. Surgery removed 85 percent of his tumor, but he refused to give up. He recovered in time to run the 2003 New York City Marathon, with his oncologist running at his side. He decided then to help others enjoy the quality of life that he was able to attain, despite his illnesses.

"I recently asked Jodi if she would run a marathon for my 100th birthday," said Brodsky. She agreed. "I think we have a pretty good chance of making it," he said. "We've been married for 42 years and if I know she has a present waiting for me, I can't disappoint her."
